
**UPDATE TO NATIONAL IMPLEMENTATION MEASURES:
LEGISLATION, PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES,
AND FACILITY AGREEMENTS**

Note by the Executive Secretary

CTBT/PTS/INF.1204 provides information and discussion on national implementation measures. Its annexes, which contain information on the current status of national implementation measures, are updated periodically. This Note provides a new update to those annexes. It was prepared following the decision by Working Group A at its Fifty-Second Session to revert to this item at its Fifty-Fourth Session (CTBT/PC-49/WGA/1, paragraph 28). The substantive discussion contained in CTBT/PTS/INF.1204 remains valid.

Summary

CTBT/PTS/INF.1204 was initially prepared at the request of Working Group A (CTBT/PC-35/WGA/1). It provides a discussion of: (1) legislation and other national measures adopted by States Signatories, (2) facility agreements and arrangements, (3) taxes and duties paid to States Signatories by the Preparatory Commission, and (4) the Provisional Technical Secretariat (PTS) programme of legal assistance. It also addresses the requests of Working Group B for information on the influence of national implementation measures on data availability (CTBT/PC-35/WGB/1, paragraph 82, CTBT/PC-36/WGB/1, paragraph 74, and CTBT/PC-37/WGB/1, paragraph 76). The updated annexes to CTBT/PTS/INF.1204 contained in this document reflect the latest statistics and information on the above four topics.

ANNEX III

OVERVIEW OF TAXES AND DUTIES PAID TO STATES SIGNATORIES

1. At its Forty-Third Session, the Preparatory Commission authorized the Provisional Technical Secretariat to prepare a biennial programme and budget for the activities of the Commission for 2016-2017 alongside an annual Programme and Budget for 2016 (CTBT/PC-43/2/Annex I/Corr.1). At its Forty-Fourth Session, the Commission approved the introduction of biennial budgeting for its activities and decided to consider the initial draft 2016-2017 Programme and Budget proposals as a basis for further discussions (CTBT/PC-44/2, paragraph 17, and Corr.1). The Commission adopted the 2016-2017 Programme and Budget at its Forty-Fifth Session (CTBT/PC-45/2, paragraph 20).
2. As of 31 December 2017, the Preparatory Commission had paid a cumulative total of US\$5 697 150 in taxes and customs duties over the period 1998-2017. The 2016-2017 Programme and Budget Performance Report (CTBT/PTS/INF.1450 and Corr.1, page 295) presents the following information on disbursements for taxes and customs duties:

3. Certain States continue to levy taxes and customs duties on the Commission. Since 2010, the PTS has routinely sent letters to States Signatories requesting the reimbursement of taxes or customs duties paid to their national tax authorities during the previous year. This practice is accepted by the External Auditor

(CTBT/PTS/INF.1351, Annex 1, Settled Recommendation 2012-3). The Commission obtained reimbursement from three States Signatories during the 2016-2017 biennium.

4. Consultations with States Signatories have helped to clarify the nature of taxes paid by the Commission and to identify the national procedures for reimbursement or alternative mechanisms to exempt the Commission. In some cases, there is no legal basis for the reimbursement of taxes. The PTS offers States Signatories its assistance in developing the legislative or administrative measures required to secure exemptions from taxes and customs duties for the Commission.

ANNEX IV

PROVISIONAL TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT PROGRAMME OF LEGAL ASSISTANCE

On request, the PTS can provide comments on draft legislation and other related assistance.
2. **Training courses, workshops and presentations:** The PTS routinely delivers presentations on aspects of national implementation at workshops, seminars, training courses, external events and academic lectures. The PTS has held workshops on national implementation measures since 2011 within the framework of public policy courses. The aim of these workshops is to provide States with tools for national self-assessment and legislative drafting assistance and to facilitate the exchange of information on legislation to implement the CTBT.
